The Bastrop Economic Development Corporation (BEDC) met on Monday, August 28, 2023, at 4:30 p.m. for a Regular Board Meeting at Bastrop City Hall, 1311 Chestnut Street. Board members present: Ron Spencer, Connie Schroeder, Charles Washington, Cheryl Lee, John Kirkland, and Lyle Nelson. Staff members present: Interim Executive Director Sylvia Carrillo, Angela Ryan, Ashley Allnutt, and Drew Chance. BEDC attorney Dan Santee was also in attendance.

- 1. CALL TO ORDER Board Chair Spencer called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m.
- 2. PUBLIC COMMENT(S) There were no public comments.

3. REGULAR BUSINESS & PRESENTATIONS

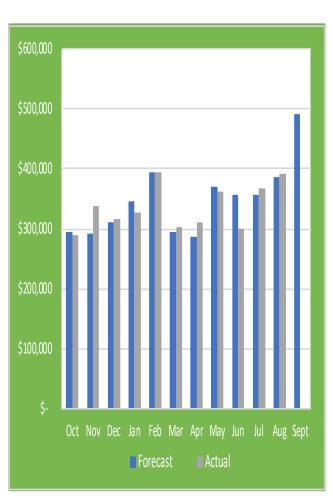

Fund Description

The purpose of the Economic Development Corporation is to enhance the quality of life in the City of Bastrop, by providing appropriate infrastructure and by promoting and assisting the kind of economic development in our community which will provide the people of Bastrop meaningful and rewarding employment opportunities and greater access to desirable goods and services.

Summary

The City of Bastrop is budgeting for \$4,746,140 of revenue in FY 2024, which represents a 12.6% increase over the prior year budget but only a 3.2% increase over FY 2023 projected. Budgeted expenditures are projected to increase by 10% or \$941,722 to \$10,350,970 in FY 2024.

Fund Description

This fund was created to track Capital Improvement Plan projects.

Summary

The City of Bastrop is budgeting for \$4,792,000 of revenue in FY 2024, which represents a 57% increase over the prior year. Budgeted expenditures are projected to increase by 67% or \$2,113,240 to \$5,265,240 in FY 2024. The projects being funded are detailed in the expenditure schedule below.

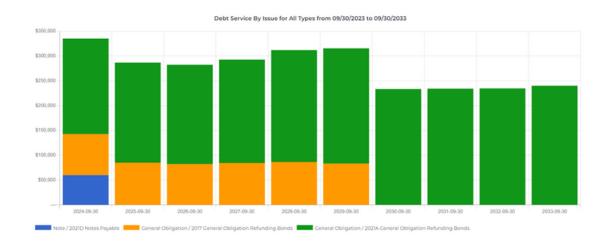

BACKGROUND/HISTORY:

The City of Bastrop applied for and was awarded a grant for the Agnes Street extension in November of 2021. During budget discussions for FY 2022, the BEDC agreed to allocate \$43,000 for the 1% match on the project. That amount was then carried over to the FY 2023 budget.

During budget preparations for FY 2024, the then Chief Financial Officer informed BEDC staff that there would be additional fees required and asked the BEDC to fund them. The total amount came to \$123,000 and was included in the budget for FY24.

The additional \$80,000 requested is due to additional engineering fees, ROW acquisition, and other costs related to the project.

FISCAL IMPACT:

\$123,000 from BEDC's FY24 budget.

RESOLUTION NO. R-2023-0012

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE BASTROP ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION APPROVING THE FUNDING OF THE EXTENSION OF THE PUBLIC ROAD KNOWN AS AGNES STREET AS AN INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT; AUTHORIZING ALL NECESSARY ACTIONS, INCLUDING EXECUTION OF NECESSARY DOCUMENTATION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Bastrop Economic Development Corporation ("BEDC") is a public instrumentality and non-profit industrial development corporation duly established and operating under Local Government Code, Chapters 501 and 505 *et seq.*, as amended, known as the Development Corporation Act of 1979 (the "Act"), and is acting with the approval of the governing body of the City of Bastrop, Texas (the "City"); and

WHEREAS, the BEDC Board of Directors ("Board") approved including funding for the Agnes Street extension in the amount of \$123,000 for Fiscal Year 2022/2023; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that the extension of the public road known as Agnes Street, and the associated necessary improvements, are "infrastructure" improvements as described in Texas Local Government Code Section 501.103; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds the aforementioned infrastructure necessary to promote or develop new or expanded business enterprises; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds the aforementioned infrastructure to be a "project" and the expenditure of BEDC funds in furtherance of the project to be authorized under Texas Local Government Code Section 501.103.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE BASTROP ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION THAT:

- **SECTION 1**. The findings set out above are hereby found to be true and correct and are incorporated herein for all purposes.
- **SECTION 2**. The extension of the public road known as Agnes Street and the associated necessary improvements are approved as a project that shall provide infrastructure that shall promote or develop new or expanded business enterprises in the area.
- **SECTION 3**. The Board authorizes the expenditure of an amount not to exceed \$123,000 in furtherance of the project identified in Section 2.
- **SECTION 4**. The Board authorizes the BEDC Interim Executive Director to take all necessary actions, including the execution all documents reasonably necessary to facilitate the purpose of this Resolution.
- **SECTION 5**. This Resolution is effective upon passage.
